A *statement* is a sentence that ends with a *period*. (.)

A *question* is a sentence that ends with a *question mark*. (?)

An *exclamation* is a sentence that shows strong feeling, such as excitement, joy, or anger. It ends with an *exclamation mark*. (!)

A *command* is a sentence that tells someone to do something. It can end with a *period* (.) or with an *exclamation mark*. (!)
