

Possessive Pronouns

A **possessive pronoun** is a pronoun that shows **ownership**. Use the possessive pronouns below to show ownership.

mine yours his hers ours theirs its

Examples: Her hair is much longer than my hair.

*Her hair is much longer than **mine**.*

Possessive pronouns **do not** use an **apostrophe** to show ownership.
